Blossom Newman did not recognize her artistic talent until the age of ten. From an ability that began with simple drawings, grew a vast interest in clay, poetry, and many other artistic pathways. At the age of 22, after spending a year studying art in Karlsruhe, Germany with her soon-to-be husband, the Brooklyn, NY native returned to America and continued her education at Hillyer

College in Hartford, Ct (now the University of Hartford). She and her husband then moved to Framingham, MA where she took classes at Harvard Extension night school and simultaneously had two children. While in Framingham, she taught Sculpture to female prisoners before relocating to the Cape in 1974. She parted ways with her first husband and has been happily remarried since 1995.
